

Grant Aid in response to the humanitarian crisis in the Province of Cabo Delgado and surrounding communities in Mozambique

- 1. On January 28th, the Government of Japan decided to extend the Grant Aid of \$3,687,000 (three million six hundred and eighty-seven thousand US dollars) for internally displaced persons living in their host communities in the Province of Cabo Delgado, Nampula and Niassa, due to deteriorating security conditions in the Province of Cabo Delgado.
- 2. The purpose of the grant is to provide life-saving food assistance, livelihood support, sexual and reproductive health services, gender-based violence response services as well as child protection services through the World Food Programme(WFP), the United Nations Population Fund(UNFPA) and the United Nations Children's Fund(UNICEF). In addition, the grant will help alleviate the impact of COVID-19.
- 3. The expected outcome of this assistance is as follows:

Life-saving food assistance for 37,630 people in Cabo Delgado

Livelihoods support for 50,000 people in Cabo Delgado

Expand the provision of life-saving sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence response services for 117,541 women and girls in Cabo Delgado, Nampula and Niassa

Improve inclusive care for unaccompanied and separated children and strengthen community capacity to improve well-being of Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) children in Cabo Delgado
