Project Objective:

Expanding the provision of life-saving sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence response services for 160,621 women and girls affected by the escalation of conflict in the northern region of Mozambique

Latest Project Updates:

- Embassy of Japan and UNFPA, together with other UN agencies, had a launching ceremony for the project in March 2021 in Maputo, Mozambique
- A Japanese UN Volunteer began in early April to support the project
- Hiring process of one maternal child health nurse is underway to scale up service delivery in Cabo Delgado
- Procurement of Dignity Kits underway to provide 3,000 women and girls with essential items
- Reproductive health kits, medical supplies and ambulances being procured to strengthen provision of life-saving sexual and reproductive health care
- Local partners identified and work plans finalized

The project aims to scale up and strengthen integrated sexual and reproductive health (SRH) and gender-based violence (GBV) services for the most vulnerable women and girls from displaced populations and host communities in Northern Mozambique.

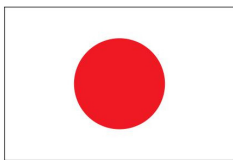

At women-friendly spaces, displaced women learn to sew face masks to sell in their communities, generate a small income and keep people safe from COVID-19.



Women in Cabo Delgado receive dignity kits, containing items such as soap, reusable sanitary napkins, and a whistle, to support their health, hygiene and safety.
