Japan-funded Project Key Progress in Nampula Province

10,300+ women & girls

received life-saving sexual & reproductive health services including family planning through Japan-funded mobile clinics, which were deployed to selected communities in Nampula nearly **140 times in total** between April - October 2021.

17,713 displaced people, including 12,400 women & girls

participated in GBV and SRH awareness-raising sessions during April - October 2021.

29 community-based activists

were trained to become agents of change and play a vital role in ensuring the most vulnerable are informed and able to access life-saving services in local communities, covering population of **34,561** in total.



AMBASSADOR'S VISIT TO PROJECT SITE IN NAMPULA

Mobile Clinic & Community-based Activists in Meconta District

Ambassador Hajime Kimura visited a Japan-funded project site in Meconta District, Nampula Province, in mid-December.

The Ambassador visited **mobile clinics**, implemented by UNFPA with a partner NGO, DKT, in partnership with the Government of Mozambique.

He interacted with **community-based activists**, who have received Japan-funded training and are providing **family planning services** & **GBV awareness-raising** to displaced women & girls & host communities.
